

**Petition for Retention and Re-Purposing of City Property at 55 W. Madison Street
(the former post office & city hall).**

Presented to the Common Council of Franklin, Indiana, and Mayor Fred Paris,
at their regularly scheduled meeting of June 7, 2010.

Whereas, the people of Franklin have since 1981 owned the historic, 1936 WPA-era former post office and city hall at 55 West Madison Street; and

Whereas, city officials have on two occasions attempted to sell this property, but have not shown competence in evaluating or marketing it; and

Whereas, city officials frequently discuss the importance of local history, particularly in our downtown, yet neglect that consideration entirely when discussing 55 W. Madison, which was rated "Outstanding" as an historical property by the Indiana DNR in their 1985 survey of historical properties in Johnson County; and

Whereas, the structure was built by the federal government to exacting standards and with the greatest care, and is still in excellent condition today; and

Whereas, city officials have made agreements to sell the former police station on Caisson Drive to Johnson County government, which will require Franklin City Court to vacate the building in some 3 years; and

Whereas, Franklin City Court now occupies approximately 4,756 square feet, 55 West Madison contains 8,609 square feet, and because future excess space in the current city hall will only produce less than half of current city court space, and will otherwise be needed in the future for the expansion of other city offices; now therefore:

We, the undersigned citizens of Franklin, hereby petition the Common Council and Mayor to retain ownership of 55 West Madison Street, designate its use for Franklin City Court, complete that transition as soon as reasonably possible, and also instruct the city Planning Department to submit the necessary documents to place the property on the State and National Registers of Historic Places.
